Ten years young.

As we celebrate our tenth anniversary, we pause to reflect and also look forward. I want to thank the thousands of donors who have made the Foundation's 130-plus funds possible.

These funds today are making a meaningful impact on the community. But what is even more satisfying is that they will be making a difference 10, 20, 50 or more years from now. That is quite a legacy to leave a community.

This idea of permanence, of helping donors do good work ... forever, which is one of the marquee benefits of working with the Foundation, is a powerful motive. It would be fairly easy to simply write a one-time check, but our donors want to do more.

Many have worked hard, raised families, and still volunteered for numerous nonprofit entities over the years. It has been a lifetime of caring for them—whether for their family or their community—and it is reflected in the funds they have established.

Because of this commitment, this year alone, the Foundation has made over \$6.3 million in grants and distributions given back to the community. Over the past 10 years, it has been \$21 million.

Ed Collier from Fitchburg Cycling Club, Inc. received a \$10,000 grant to host the 2012 Fitchburg Longsjo Classic, a pro/am cycling competition the community hosts each vear.



Gardner Group, Inc. will use its \$20,000 grant to update its Westminster facility to meet current building codes. The non-profit agency provides "line-of-fire" services to help restore first responders coping abilities, energy level and commitment to their work. In addition, they offer programs dealing with substance abuse, as well as stress management, through training, counseling, educational and family support services.



The Horizons for Homeless Children, which provides services for homeless children, is refurbishing a play space in Leominster through a \$3,250 grant, in addition to replenishing supplies at all three of its sites. They will also use some of the funds to recruit and train more volunteers.

Literacy Volunteers of the Montachusett Area received \$4,000 for its Tutor Training Program. It will conduct four 18-hour tutor trainings, and provide books and materials to use when teaching. Having more trained tutors will allow 40 individuals on the waiting list to receive services.



Our Father's House, Inc., which currently provides overnight shelter only, will use a \$19,000 grant to remain open three days a week, providing therapeutic self-help to the homeless. By opening the shelter during the day, even on a limited basis, clients will have a safe indoor location away from harsh weather, as well as the benefit of increased support from the group sessions.



The United Arc of Franklin and Hampshire Counties, Inc. is launching a Positive Parenting Program – North Quabbin Services – with its \$20,000 grant, which will provide a series of parent education and support groups for parents with intellectual disabilities or functional limitations.



Mount Grace Land Conservation Trust, Inc. received an \$8,800 grant for its Service Learning Project, which will provide young people with skills and hands-on service learning opportunities that will improve recreational trails, signage for trails and protection of vernal pools. The Athol town manager, Orange town administrator, North Quabbin Chamber of Commerce and numerous other organizations are collaborating on the initiative.

Nashua River Watershed Association's grant of \$14,350 will help control purple loosestrife along the Nashua River. The goal is to reduce loosestrife by 20 percent in two years and 80 percent in 10 years, enabling the re-establishment of native plants along the river in Clinton, Fitchburg, Littleton, Shirley and Westminster.



Pat Brody Shelter for Cats, Inc.'s \$5,000 grant will provide spay/neuter clinics for cats to low-income residents of Fitchburg and Leominster.



The Trustees of Reservations will create a new community garden on Lindell Avenue, Leominster. The \$12,500 grant for the Twin Cities Community Garden Project will be used in collaboration with the Boys & Girls Club of North Central Massachusetts.



Helping address substance abuse, mental health professionals will deliver a structured, preventative message about alcohol and substance abuse to those who have not yet used illicit substances, through a \$9,276 grant to the Lowell House Inc.'s Darby Fassett Project, "Be the One."



A \$15,000 grant to the Friends of Nashoba Valley, a group that supports Nashoba Valley Medical Center, will be used to purchase a teleneurological camera, in order to provide high quality 24/7 access to consult and assess patients with neurology symptoms.



Doctor Franklin Perkins School of Lancaster will use its \$10,000 grant for the Kid Fit Healthy Lifestyle Community Project, designed to improve the physical and mental health, physical fitness level and leisure skills of children.



Community Healthlink, Inc., received a \$20,000 grant for school support services for five schools in the Nashoba Valley region. The grant will be used for consultations with teachers, not covered by insurance, to enhance and extend mental health and substance abuse therapeutic services now provided in area schools.

L.U.K. Crisis Center, Inc., Fitchburg received an \$18,000 grant for the Youth Partnering for Recovery (YPR) Project, serving 20 youths in the Nashoba Valley region needing assistance with substance abuse and coexisting mental health issues.

Distributions

Over the past 10-years, donors have established over 130 funds. This year, these funds distributed over \$6.3 million to a variety of issues and needs the donors care passionately about.

Donor Advised Funds. You can have ongoing involvement in the use of your gift. You work with our professional program staff, identifying ways to use dollars from the Donor Advised Fund you establish to address the issues and needs you care about most. Your recommendations are submitted to our local board for approval; we then distribute grant dollars.

Field of Interest Funds. You can target your gift to address needs in an important area of community life. Arts. AIDS. Aging. At-risk youth. You identify your personal interest area when making your gift; our board awards grants to community organizations and programs that are making a difference in the area you select.

Scholarships. You can invest your gift in our community's future and show students you care, all with the guidance and personal services of your community foundation. You determine the criteria students must meet to receive the Scholarship you establish. With your assistance, students achieve their academic and careeroriented goals—from preschool to postgraduate work.

Designated Funds. You can direct your gift to a specific nonprofit organization or purpose. Help provide ongoing funding for a senior center, museum, or virtually any nonprofit charitable organization. Nonprofit organizations can use a Designated Fund through the community foundation to build their endowment and enhance their ability to accept large and complex gifts.


